

Police Committee Meeting

February 9, 2015

The police committee meeting of the City of Lexington was call to order at 6:30 pm by committee chairman Phelps.

Physically present Police Chief Belvery, Alderman Phelps, and Alderman Miller.

Chief Belvery informed us that the new Wolf body cameras have been received and will be implemented by 2/13/15. He stated that the use policy for the cameras has been written.

The chief informed us that the wiring for the radios and computer in the Crown Victoria needs to be replaced. The cost will be \$2400. In addition, will include making all of the lights functional on the light bar. Also, the laptop computer will be removed and replaced with the new Tough Book Computers.

The current hand held radar gun needs repair. The wiring is frayed and it needs a new battery. The price to repair it is roughly half the price for a new unit. This unit is at least twelve years old and is considered outdated. It was agreed that a new on be purchased for \$876. The purchase will be postponed and this will be included in next year's police budget.

Part time officer Dustin Carter will be going through the PTI training that will last through the end of the year. The cost is \$1540. And must be paid up front. After successfully completing the testing on Jan, 9 2016 we will be reimbursed the cost.

Alice Training (Alert, lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate) will be February 24-25, 2015.

Next board meeting will discuss participation in the State of Illinois Surplus Property Program. We have received five used Tazer units. One works completely and the others need some minor repair. This is a significant savings over new ones.
